

Information from the Provisional Administrator of **Mopac modern packaging AG** to the Creditors and the Media

Dr. Fritz Rothenbühler, attorney-at-law of Wenger Plattner, appointed provisional administrator of Mopac modern packaging AG - tasks

Bern, 1 April 2015. On Monday, 30 March 2015, the regional court of Emmental-Oberaargau approved the petition for a provisional debt restructuring moratorium of Mopac modern packaging AG (Mopac). Dr. Fritz Rothenbühler, attorney-at-law of Wenger Plattner in Bern, has been appointed provisional administrator.

The task of the provisional administrator is to supervise the business activities of Mopac in the interest of all creditors. Furthermore, he has to value the company's assets, assess its profit and income situation and decide what prospects it has of returning to financial soundness. He has to report on these matters to the judge by 30 July 2015 latest. The provisional administrator's task is to safeguard creditors' rights.

Together with the president of the Board of Directors, Dr. Peter Bratschi, the provisional administrator, Dr. Fritz Rothenbühler, has informed the workforce in Wasen and Erswil yesterday.

The provisional administrator and his staff held preliminary talks with the company management of Mopac and representatives of the banks. Public authorities have also been informed. The provisional administrator and his staff are engaged in clarifying points of substance and problems and ranking them in order of urgency. At the same time, liaising closely with all the authorities, they will be compiling a list of decisions to be taken.

The provisional administrator intends to inform the media if required. It is planned to set up a website which will make information from the provisional administrator accessible to all concerned parties and interested members of the public. (www.sachwalter-mopac.ch).
